By all accounts, the Bottle Bill has been a success. But the Bottle Bill can <u>work</u> <u>even harder</u> for New York. As we celebrate the Bottle Bill's 21st anniversary, it's time to bring it up to date to meet our state's current and future needs.

NEW YORK NEEDS A BIGGER, BETTER BOTTLE BILL

Bills have been introduced in the State Legislature to improve the Bottle Bill in several important ways. These bills would make the state law:

- Bigger -- by expanding coverage of the Bottle Bill to include non-carbonated beverages like bottled water, iced tea and sport drinks;
- **Better** -- by requiring that unclaimed deposits (an estimated \$80+ million a year) be returned to the state to fund local recycling programs; and,

More effective -- by ensuring that more bottles and cans are returned and recycled rather than sent to landfills and incinerators.
